

Adult Explorations for April Meets at 10:15 am Following Worship

April 7 ~ "Park Forest Preschool" ~ led by Connie Schultz ~ Westminster Hall

The Park Forest Preschool was founded in the spring of 1967 to help educate neighborhood preschool children whose parents could not afford the cost. Today, the Park Forest Preschool is a nonprofit, tuition-free school for children ages 2-4 from low-income families, and is supported by multiple contributors, including SCPC. Come learn more about this organization and its impact on children and families in our community.

April 14 ~ Reception for SCPC's new Senior Pastor, Scott Hoffman ~ Social Hall

April 14 is Pastor Scott Hoffman's first Sunday at SCPC. Please join us in the Social Hall for a reception to welcome him.

April 21 ~ "Rachel Carson—Voice of Nature" ~ led by the Sustainability Circle ~ Westminster Hall This documentary describes the life and legacy of marine biologist and nature writer Rachel Carson, a native of Pennsylvania. Inspired by a supportive mother, her natural surroundings, and the Allegheny River, her formative years in Western Pennsylvania shaped her passionate environmental ethic. Her 1962 book <u>Silent</u> <u>Spring</u>, which publicized the harmful effects of pesticides, helped to launch the global environmental movement.

April 28 ~ Storm Bucket Packing ~ led by the Social Justice & Mission Team ~ Social & Westminster Halls In honor of Earth Week and to engage in Earth and Climate service, the Social Justice & Mission Team will host a "storm bucket packing" event to provide supplies for those impacted by increasingly-prolific flood and fire events. Storm buckets contain supplies like trash bags, gloves, bleach and other items that help people weather and clean up after a disaster. Participants of all ages will join a "Connecting Conversations" activity at Coffee Hour in the Social Hall. Then, small groups will be invited to take part in specific steps of bucket packing in Westminster Hall and return to coffee hour for more conversation and snacks.

April 7, 14, 21, & 28 ~ "Connect" ~ led by Zack Maser, Jamie Bauman, and Laura Millard in Room 10 Connect is an invitation to deepen your relationship with others and with God by contemplating scripture, lyrics, writing, poetry, and other topics of interest through small group discussions. This is meant to be a time to sit with

questions without needing the answers, speak from the heart, pray, meditate, reflect, and be changed by the stories and sharing of others. Anyone with a desire to Connect more deeply, whether you are a believer or unsure what you believe, is invited to join us. Come as you are to listen, share, grow, and be!

We hope you'll mark your calendars for a big **Mission and Community Sunday on April 28th**, when Coffee Hour and Exploration Hour will merge for multigenerational bucket packing, plus snacking and chatting, with an exciting Connecting Conversations project from Explore (more on that on page 4, and a bit of a preview to come in your Weekly Update).

C pring is springing and the streams are flowing! We will be joining the Clearwater Conservancy's Watershed

Cleanup Day on April 20th, from 8:00 am-noon – the day before our Creation Care Sunday service. **Come be part of the crew!**

This annual event has been going on since 1997, and has kept more than 6 million pounds of trash from entering our local waterways!

We expect to spend four hours of hard but rewarding work picking up trash along a local road or waterway – lots of bending over and getting dirty or muddy. Last year, 13 of us collected 15 bags of trash.

We will be assigned a route and given trash bags, safety vests, work gloves, and a location along the route to drop off the filled bags. The event is more suitable for adults and older kids, since it requires attention and effort and will be along roads and waterways.
